#### New area code number will be 563

Eastern lowa's new area code will be 563. The lowa Utilities Board recently chose to split the existing 319 are code into two regions as a remedy for the diminishing supply of local telephone exchange numbers. One region will keep 319 and the other will get the new number.

The board has established a phase-in period scheduled to begin on March 4, 2001, with a mandatory cutoff date of Sept. 9, 2001. During the phase-in period, callers may use either 319 or the new 563 area code to complete calls in the 563 region. Beginning on the mandatory date, callers using the 319 area code to call a 563 number will hear a message advising them that the area code has changed.

### Midland Times: December 11, 1980 – Page 1 Wyoming Christmas lights go up and down

Over thirty people along with tractors and forklifts turned out on Sunday, November 30 to help make Wyoming the "Christmas City". This was one of the largest crews ever and they completed the job in less than three hours. Following the work, coffee and hot chocolate were served at the Midway Cafe.

On Friday December 5, some of the lights came down faster than they went up. A modular home being transported struck several overhead strings of lights in both Wyoming and Oxford Junction and ripped the strings from their positions. The result was broken wires and bulbs as the oversized load continued down the highway. Repairs were completed this past Sunday and the lights turned on that evening. A few minor adjustments need to be done and all the lights will be turned on.

The help of all the folks that took time from their busy schedules to help make Wyoming the "Christmas City" was gratefully appreciated.

#### The Wyoming Journal: December 2, 1875 - Page 1

ALARM OF FIRE. – An alarm of fire on Tuesday morning was the cause of no little excitement. The bucket brigade were on hand in the twinkling of an eye, but happily the fire was put out before it had on opportunity to spread any. It occurred at R. Gilbert's house.

NOTE: Mr. Russell Gilbert moved to Wyoming, Iowa, in 1856 and had a mercantile business with his brother. He lived in Wyoming for 37 years before moving to Pawnee City, Nebraska, where he died seven years later. His widow and son brought his body back to Wyoming for interment.

# The Wyoming Journal: December 2, 1875 – Page 1 Family Gathering

Last Friday, Nov. 26, we were permitted by invitation of Mr. and Mrs. Willard Niles, Sen., to participate with a few of their many friends in celebrating the fortieth anniversary of their marriage. It was one of those occasions in which the purest social enjoyment and festivity, is mingled with that that is akin almost to sadness – joy at meeting a couple who have walked life's pathway for *forty years* and through all that time have earned by their christian lives and usefulness the love of all, and sadness that the days of those lives are eventually drawing towards the end, and that soon we shall miss their familiar faces from among us though the sweet odor of their lives and example, will remain long on earth. After passing a very pleasant hour in social converse, the company partook of a bountiful feast...

Note: The article sounds like the couple was at death's door. Mr. Niles passed January 8, 1885 at the age of 81 and Mrs. Niles "fell asleep in Jesus" August 31, 1886 at the age of 79.

#### Jones County nonprofits awarded \$109,000

The Jones County Community Foundation celebrated 21 local nonprofits and charitable organizations this month, awarding them \$109,486 from its annual grant cycle during an event at Caulkins Barn in Wyoming.
