Prior to June 6th mail was collected Monday through Saturday at 4:00 pm. Beginning June 6th, mail is now collected at 3:00 pm Monday through Friday and at 8:15 am on Saturday. Previously, you could deposit mail in the outside box and it was picked up at 4:00 pm. **After June 6th**, any mail deposited after 3:00 pm weekdays and 8:15 am on Saturdays will not go out until the next day.

Remember, your mail must be deposited in one of the boxes by 3:00 pm, Monday through Friday and 8:15 am Saturdays for it to go out that day.

Looking Back:

Anamosa Journal: June 6, 1935 - Corn cultivation will be begun throughout this locality this week. Not much replanting is reported. Several have planted their excess corn acreage to popcorn. Herman Brunscheen has planted 70 acres to popcorn while Frank Pealer has planted 30 acres.

Wyoming Journal: June 7, 1934 – Band Plays First Summer Concert – Wyoming's district champion high school band played the first concert of the summer season on the streets of Wyoming Wednesday evening and a big crowd gathered to enjoy the music and vigorously applaud favorite numbers. The concerts are brought to the people of the community through the generosity of Wyoming Merchants who desire that every music lover in the countryside can enjoy the treat. (Ed note: concerts continued until at least 1963, performed by the Calkins office on a hay rack with drop sides to make it bigger and yellow lights from the Christmas lights. The steel wheeled running gear for the bandstand is still at the fairgrounds.)

In response to this item in the previous newsletter, "At the end of the school year, Nancy Collins will be retiring from school bus driving for the Midland School District. She has been taking great care of everyone's "darling" children for 34 years!", our reader Larry Bearce, Sr sent the following:

As A Wyoming Iowa resident for some 53 years (Born 9-7-1939) I remember lots of happenings and this is one of them; Claire Bremer was raised on the farm (THE BREMER FARM CLAIRE & IVETA MATJKA) where Nancy and Scott now live, he also operated a school bus which was a 1940'S Ford Panel truck with two benches as seats in back for short routes. If I remember right Claire would also take us kids to Oxford Junction to the shows on Saturday Night and the cost was: (25 Cents) 10 cents for Claire, 10 cents for the show and a nickel for a treat after the show.

Midland School – A complete tearoff of the roof on the east wing is underway. This building was constructed in the mid to late 50's. Since that time, more and more layers have been added.

Fairgrounds – A new structure was started this week to serve as an office/entry booth and announcer's booth for the horse arena. This one is located at the southwest corner of the arena. The previous one, located on the north side of the arena, was flattened in a windstorm several years ago.
