Dear Midland Families and Community,

Happy February! I hope the new year is treating you well and that you have been able to stay warm! We have had many wonderful moments already this year, and I want to take this opportunity to share some highlights and excitement as we move into the spring 😊 semester.



One thing that continues to make Midland special is the way our students support and encourage each other. Our wrestling cheer team has been bringing great energy and spirit to competition, cheering on classmates and lifting the whole crowd. Moments like that reflect our strong Eagle pride and sense of community. This can make us all feel proud of our students!

We are also thrilled to see students in classrooms making learning both meaningful and fun. For example, Spanish students recently enjoyed planning a mock camping trip complete with treats like s'mores as they practiced new vocabulary. I also want to share some positive financial news. Based on current projections, we anticipate the district tax rate decreasing by approximately two to three dollars, moving from nearly sixteen dollars to the thirteen dollar range. This improvement reflects the district's strong financial recovery over the past few years and the fact that our cash reserve levy is now above twenty percent, which allows us to responsibly reduce taxes.

Student enrollment plays a significant role in this picture. The more students we serve, the more funding the district receives, which helps support programs and can reduce pressure on the local tax rate. When resident students attend Midland rather than open enrolling out, those education dollars stay in our community and work for our schools - rather than our tax dollars being sent to other communities and schools. While future adjustments may still be necessary, maintaining strong enrollment helps strengthen both our schools and the overall financial health of the district.

Thank you for your continued support of Midland students, staff, and activities. Whether cheering at a game, attending a concert, supporting our extra curricular programs, or encouraging your child at home, your engagement makes a lasting impact. Together, we continue building an environment where every student can thrive academically, socially, and personally.

Life Cycle Learning

Our mealworms have arrived, and second graders are excited to begin learning about the mealworm life cycle! Students have been discussing what living things need to survive (air, water, food, and space) and will now apply that knowledge through hands-on learning.

Students have been divided into small groups and given mealworms to care for over the next few weeks. They will be responsible for feeding and caring for their mealworms as they move through the life cycle, with the goal of observing the transformation into a darkling beetle. As students clean their vials, they will carefully monitor and record the changes they observe, strengthening their science observation and recording skills.
